

2020 RES framework - national targets and progress

Croatian RES target: 20% in 2020





Current status of RES in the EU



- 2013: 14% of renewable energy in final energy consumption
- 13 Member States are more than 2% above the interim target

EU may not reach the 2020 target without:

- Additional policy measures
- Investments in grid and infrastructure
- Creating stable, yet flexible supporting systems
